What are the HUD Data Standards?

These standards provide explicit instructions for HMIS data collection and are updated every two years. The new FY 2026 standards will impact everything from questions asked to the overall data entry workflow starting October 1st, 2025

New

As of October 1st, HUD is requiring the "Sex" field to be collected for all new program enrollments.*

*This excludes Coordinated Entry Program enrollments.

**HUD is prohibiting mapping data from the gender field to the new sex field.
